

Get to know your fellow teachers, daydream European trips to take together, and start your experience in Germany with a full heart, mind, and... of course, tummy.


#### CAMP ACCOMMODATIONS

You must be/have...



Aged between 19 and 29



Are a Native English speaker

Passport holder from USA, Canada, UK, Ireland, South Africa, Australia or New Zealand



Successful completion of High School (A-levels, Leaving Cert, Matric)



Adaptable and able to socialize and interact with people



A valid First Aid certificate (available at camp for €65)

## 8 GERMANY FACTS

The world's narrowest street is in Reutlingen. It is called Spreuerhofstrasse and is 31 cm (one foot) wide at its narrowest point. ## FAQ

## I've already completed a TEFL course, can I get a discount?

Yes! So long as you've completed comprehensive TEFL training, you'll be eligible for a further discount. <u>Contact us</u> to find out how much extra you'll save.

#### How long before my start date should I arrive?

You should book flights to arrive into the Hamburg airport (HAM) on your specific internship arrival day, for airport pick up and orientation. Alternatively you can join a pre-organized shuttle from Walsrode train station.

## How do I get from orientation to my placement?

At the end of your orientation week, you'll travel by public transport (bus, train or air) to your camp location. Transport will be arranged and costs are covered.

#### Will I be placed with other interns?

Yes, you will be part of a large team of fellow interns and camp leaders.

You'll get to know each other during orientation so it will be easy to plan meet-ups with new friends - you'll be joining a great community of camp teachers and leaders!

#### How much will I get paid?

Your €75 (US\$80/£64) weekly allowance will be paid in cash. You will receive €290 at the end of week 5 (orientation week plus 4 weeks of camp). For every additional week you stay, you'll receive €75 allowance. You should budget to have enough spending money to cover your first month until you receive your allowance.

**TIP:** Our previous interns say your first month can often be when you spend more excursions, socialising and getting settled in. We recommend you try to budget a little extra per month for trips and then an emergency fund / credit card for unexpected events.

#### Who will I be teaching?

You'll be working in an adventure and English language summer camp.

#### Can I be placed with a friend?

Yes, you can request to be placed with a friend or as a couple. You'll have a spot on your application form to mention who you're traveling with.

**Note:** placement together is dependent on availability and can't be guaranteed.

#### Where will I be located?

There are camp locations throughout Germany including: Walsrode (Lüneburger Heide), Regen, Hachen, Mölln. For those interns who stay longer, you'll enjoy experiencing more than one camp location.

#### What will my housing be like?

Accommodation is provided throughout your entire stay on the internship in shared tents (4 - 5 teachers together) or a shared room in a hostel. Budget €40 for a sleeping bag and €35 for a mat if you prefer not to bring one.

## I have dietary requirements, will I manage okay?

Yes, previous interns with both gluten and dairy free requirements as well as vegetarians have managed well with advice from our in-country team.

#### What extras do I need to pay for?

- Doctor's letter (to say you're fit and well) -Criminal record check
- Comprehensive travel insurance
- Visa (if required)
- Flights
- Sleeping bag / mat
- First Aid course (if you don't hold a valid certificate.

The  $\in$ 65 will be deducted from your pocket money.

#### Can I book a one-way flight?

We advise booking a flexible ticket so you have the freedom to make travel plans while you're there. Many previous participants plan onward travel together around Europe after camp. It's recommended that you try not to plan too much of an itinerary prior to arrival.

#### Is there a chance I won't be accepted?

As with any internship your spot isn't guaranteed. Your application is subject to camp management approval.
